
LILLIPUT

Lemuel Gulliver worked as a doctor on a ship. On May, 4th 1699 he left Bristol with his crew but the ship sank and he was the only survivor. He swam and was tired but then he arrived on an island. He slept and when he woke up, he was tied to the ground! The inhabitants of the island, the Lilliputians, were very little people and they were afraid of him! After that, they understood that Gulliver was good and so they gave him food, water and a place to live in. They also taught him to speak their own language and Gulliver promised to help them to fight against their enemies, the people living on the island of Blefuscu.

LILLIPUT VS BLEFUSCU

The conflict between the two islands had begun in the past and it was still going on. Gulliver was ready to defend Lilliputians. He made a plan but he didn't destroy Blefuscu. Blefuscu's king was happy, but Lilliput's king was angry with Gulliver. Gulliver, to demonstrate to be still the king's friend, helped him to exhaust a fire at his palace urinating on it, but the queen didn't appreciate this so he moved to Blefuscu and after one year he came back home to his wife and children.






BROBDINGNAG



Lemuel returned to Bristol on 3rd June 1706.

He was born in Nottinghamshire in 1661. His family came from in Oxfordshire. He supposedly studied for three years in Cambridge to become a doctor as his father wanted.

- ❖ He is honest and courageous
- ❖ He is a little simpleton
- ❖ Swift gives him a name that is similar to “gullible” = “ingenuo”
- ❖ He never expresses openly their emotions and feelings, as other heroes and travelers do: Ulysses and Aeneas
- ❖ He has a great love for his homeland: he fights to defend it.

LILLIPUTIANS and BLEFUSCUDIANS


- The Lilliputians are the first people that Gulliver meets: they are little men less than 6 inches in height, but with a high opinion of themselves and a solid self-esteem. While being hospitable to respect the conventions and etiquette, they are generally careerists, envious, jealous, incapable of gratitude. Their minister Flimnap is a parody of the British minister Walpole.
- After, Gulliver meets Blefuscudians: they are like Lilliputians for their dimensions, but the two populations are in battle for something happened in the past.

THE FARMER AND GLUMDALCLITCH



THE QUEEN AND THE KING




The king and queen were giants, they also had human characteristics; they were middle-aged, very kind, intelligent and hospitable.




